Our prayers this week are for Iuri and Plamy Valkov in Sliven, Bulgaria. They lead the Aleteia Baptist Church and work with the vulnerable and poor people in Sliven. This is done through the Women and Young People's Safe Houses, Men's Institutes, Older Peoples home, Orphanages and Gypsy Villages, and more.

We focus our prayers on finance, for multiple reasons.

On 1st January, Bulgaria is officially adopting the Euro. This is leading to rapid price changes, low wages which cannot keep up with inflation, and general anxiety particularly from those who don't understand how the Euro works. Add this to the years of political stability, and Bulgaria is in a time of change and uncertainty.

Furthermore, Krasif Aid – the charity that administers our support the Valkovs through, and give extra aid to Sliven – have announced that the charity will be closing in the next 2 years. Support to the Valkov family and Sliven will end in mid-2027, and this also affects Krasif Aid's other supported churches and projects around Bulgaria.

The church have been developing plans to self-sustain their finances, including the idea for a Christian bookshop in the Blue House. However these plans have taken longer than expected for multiple reasons – once again finance is a factor, as the support from Krasif Aid to the Blue House ended in July. The church are now struggling to cover the full wages of the couple of people employed there.

There are also plenty of ways Iuri and Plamy are thankful for their family life, and their 3 children Victor, Eva and Yulia – details in the newsletter linked above. But there is a great need for prayer, especially into the Winter season when living costs are more expensive.

Thank you to all who gave to our Christmas gift for our Mission Partners – the extra money makes a big difference to families such as these.
