The *Vacancy in See Committee* are now seeking the views of churches across the Diocese, to put together a “Statement of Needs” about what people would like to see in the new Bishop (similar to when we made the Parish Profile to look for a new Vicar).

THIS SUNDAY

Last term, we asked “What is the good news?”. This week we begin a follow-on series aiming at encouraging and building up the body of Christ, shaped around how we get real, gritty, forward-looking hope in the midst of this world. The series breakdown is:

- Jan 11th – People can be chaotic, but God our Father is faithful to His world
- Jan 18th – Things can be bad, but God our Father works for good through all things.
- Jan 25th – Jesus and Bartimaeus (Bartimaeus had hope!).
- Feb 1st – Evil is real, but Jesus our King trampled it on the cross.
- Feb 8th – We don’t know the future, but Jesus is the Lamb who unlocks all of History.
- Feb 15th – We can’t control everything, but the Holy Spirit is God’s guarantee of the future.

We begin by thinking about just how chaotic our world is today. At the beginning of a new year, where do we stand?

At St Michael’s, we have an all-age service and welcome Jude and his family as we celebrate his baptism.

At Whitegrove, we have our usual children’s groups running.

This week is an exception, but from next week we have standardised our service patterns so that our Communion and All-Age services are consistent across both our 10:30 congregations.

MISSION PARTNERS: THE CLEMISONS



Our prayers this week are for Peter and Becky Clemison. They work in Cebu in the Philippines, with several initiatives to help struggling families and trafficked children, and have set up a charity called 4Freedom. - As part of the Safe Families program, Becky led a parenting seminar to over 25 people – the room was full enough that people had to listen from outside!

- And finally – the 4Freedom charity has officially received its CRLTO and NPSP statuses in the Philippines! These allow 4Freedom to legally conduct more activities and services nationwide, and opens more paths to develop local funding sources.
