Could you serve on our PCC?

Have you ever wondered how decisions are made about the life of our church? The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is the team that shape our vision and mission — and we're always looking for people who care about our church and community to be part of that journey.

Joining the PCC is a chance to share your ideas, use your gifts, pray, and help our church develop as a disciple making movement! It's not about being an expert — it's about being willing to take part. You can be a young Christian, or not. It would be great to have a variety of people — of different ages and stages, and drawn from across our congregations.

What Is the PCC?

The PCC is a team of vicars and church members who are elected to represent the parish. Together, they make decisions that help the church look to the future. From supporting worship, discipleship and outreach to caring for buildings and finances, the PCC helps ensure our church remains welcoming, active, and faithful to God's calling.

PCC members are also charity trustees, sharing responsibility for stewarding the church's resources wisely and transparently.

What Would I Be Doing?

PCC members meet regularly on different nights to pray, talk, plan, and make decisions together. You'll help discern vision, care for people, focus on mission and oversee church finances and buildings. Safeguarding is an important part of this shared responsibility, helping us keep our church a safe and caring place for everyone. Everyone has basic training and needs a DBS.

Most importantly, you'll be part of a supportive team where every voice matters. No special qualifications are required — just a willingness to listen, contribute, and work together.

Could you serve on Deanery Synod?

This is an opportunity to take part in the wider life and governance of the Church beyond our own parish. The deanery synod brings together clergy and people from local churches across Bracknell to share ideas, discuss challenges, and help shape mission and ministry across the area. It is a place where local voices influence bigger conversations.

It's playing our part in making sure we are not looking inward, or building our own little empire, but serving and loving the whole body of Christ in our area.

Deanery Synod reps are automatically on our PCC.
